Curriculum theme

Creative Skills and Physical Development

Our curriculum theme this term is "Plants and animals in Hackney".



You can support at home by helping your young person to explore the world around them through their senses. Offer them opportunities to explore different (non-toxic) plants through touch (aloe vera), smell (Lavender, basil), taste (mint). Offer them opportunities to explore different animal sounds (dog, cat, cow etc) and textures (fur, scales, feathers). You can read books and sing songs about plants and animals ("Jack & the beanstalk", "Old MacDonald", "Incy Wincy spider"). Please look at the school website for examples of sensory stories and drama games that you can also use. You could also consider visits to Clissold Park or Hackney City Farm, which have live animals, and Pets At Home near Newbury

Music Style/Genre this term is Britpop. We are also learning about playing fast and slow, and playing chords: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bx1Bh8ZvH84

The Art inspiration this term is Plants and Animals in Hackney. We will look at the work of Andy Goldsworthy. We will explore 3D structures with clay and natural objects. We will also experiment making botanical monoprints using ink and watercolours. Andy Goldsworthy's art can be found at the British Council Collection and the Government Art Collection in London.
