Curriculum theme

Creative Skills and Physical Development

Our curriculum theme this term is "The Environment". You can support at home by:

Plants

To help your young person to understand how to care for living plants and the environment, we will be sending home a small plant for them to care for by making sure the plant has sufficient sunlight, water, and ventilation. They can share the progress of the plant by sending it back to school at the end of the term.

Animals

Help your young person to observe different animals when visiting the park/playground. You could also consider visits to Clissold Park or Hackney City Farm, which have live animals, and Pets At Home near Newbury Park underground station.

• The Environment

Help your young person recognise which household items go into your recycling and which go into landfill.

The Art inspiration this term is Plants and Animals in Hackney. We will look at the work of Andy Goldsworthy. We will explore 3D structures with clay and natural objects. We will also experiment making botanical monoprints using ink and watercolours. Andy Goldsworthy's art can be found at the British Council Collection and the Government Art Collection in London.

The PE topic this term is "Games", with a focus on vocabulary: Push, Roll, Kick, Bounce, Hit
